Reception children found it strange that in France, people eat snails. They were not impressed with this thought!













Our week in key stage 1




Our week in lower key stage 2



Our week in upper key stage 2

This week, Year 5 have worked incredibly hard during their final assessment week. They have also been learning about current global issues in their theme lessons. This week, the children explored whether we live in a peaceful world and what could be done to ensure that it remains peaceful. The children gave some very insightful answers and showed real maturity when discussing such sensitive issues.

In Year 6, children have been learning about the circulatory system in science. They were able to identify the different parts of the human heart and could describe how the heart and lungs work together to supply oxygenated blood to the body. The children were fascinated by how the heart works tirelessly for the duration of a person's life and asked brilliant questions about the inner workings of the human body.
